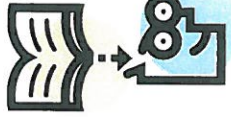


I muri i tera i haere tatou ki tētahi atu ruma ki te titiro i ētahi kō, arā, he 'Maori Shovel'.

I te tuatahi i te kōrero a Kōka Ambar e pa ana ki tō mātou Atua. I te patai a Kōka Ambar i etahi kōrero pera i te hononga o ngā Atua. Tuaria i mauria a Kōka Ambar i a mātou ki te titiro ki etahi taonga, pērā i te 'Kō' he momo taihaha.

Tuatoru, i titiro mātou ki etahi Atua, pērā, i a Tāne. Ko ia te Atua o te ngahere, ēngari, i huri ia ki tētahi tangata tino kino, nō te mea, kaore ka tiaki pai kia Papatuanuku.
