## **CURRICULUM.**

- 1. Poutama Tau:** The school has won a MOE Early Numeracy Contract worth \$3375 for the Syndicate B junior teaching staff with Karin Mahuika. At the same time – Koka Karen Pewhairangi will pilot with the senior teachers of Syndicate B the Middle Numeracy Programme in Te Reo Maori. The ministry has not provided money for the release of the teachers, however we will not have to pay for the services of Koka Karen Pewhairangi, the MOE facilitator. Next year Syndicate A will be included in the ENP contract. We would have liked to have taken part in the contract for this year, but the MOE changed the processes.
- 2. The ASSTLE Project.** Rms 5 and 6 took part in the Assessment Tools for Teaching & Learning Project's trialing their three tests in Te Reo Maori – Panui, Tuhituhi and Pangarau. The teachers have until the end of this week to administer the tests. We will send the tests back to Auckland University and by mid term 2, a report for each child will be in our hands.
- 3. SEA / AKA – The School Entry Assessments / Aromatawai Urunga-a-Kura.** Koka Keita Ngata RTM, trained Koka Raiha Moetara, Koka Karryn Heaps and the Principal. The aim being to carry out the SEA/AKA tests with each 5 year old pupil. Koka Raiha takes Synd. B's 5 yr olds, Koka Karryn takes Synd. A's 5 yr olds. The tests: Concepts of Print, a language activity to assess Oral Language and a shopping game to assess Numeracy, are in Maori and Eng. The 6 year Surveys – Koka Karryn will take the Synd. A 6 year olds and Koka Keita takes TWRM 6 year olds.

## **SPECIAL EDUCATION Programmes.**

- The school's Special Education Team has been especially busy this term with a high focus on literacy learning difficulties; pupils affected by natural conditions and some non-compliance or behaviour cases that require/d outside agency support. We have been especially pleased with parental interest, support and input, working alongside the school and sometimes outside agents to ensure the success of the children's progress. Special thanks to **Koka Yvonne Williams** our school's RTLb liaison advisor, with **Koka Kelly Pohe**, the Maori RTLb and **Koka Karryn Heaps** for their valuable work.
- The school's P.A. & Senior School Basic Facts tests will be issued to the BOT next month. We note that special extension requirements will be needed for a child who has umber 9 stanines i.e. this child's scored 96+% in all PA tests.
- The Board and school coped for the first time with the sad and most difficult task of excluding a pupil from our school in the interests of the safety of all pupils and especially our young pupils.

## **PERSONNEL.**

### **1. The resignation of the BOT Chairperson.**

It is with regret that the BOT has accepted the resignation of the **BOT Chairperson, Mrs Kim Pardoe**. Mr Steven Pardoe, her husband, has been successful in obtaining a new job in Hamilton. We especially thank Kim for undertaking this honourable position that required determination, commitment, an inner wisdom and the ability to keep up to date with current MOE and BOT processes and procedures. Congratulations and best wishes to Kim and the Pardoe Whanau.

2. We announce with regret also that **Koka Maureen Ratapu's** job will conclude this term due to the fact that she is the teacher aide for the High Needs ORS child, one of the Pardoe boys. The ORS funding goes with the child.

3. Matua **Morehu Nikora is Acting-Chairperson** at this time. Nominations for the Board's Vacancy will be advertised early next term. Take time to consider if you can help your school in this way. Surprisingly, it will benefit you in many different ways, but most importantly it will benefit our children and also our staff. Ka nui te mihi ki a koe Matua Morehu!

## **PROPERTY:**

### **1. The LIBRARY EXTENSIONS to create A Community ICT Learning Centre.**

The building extensions will be blessed this Thursday 28.03.02 at 1:15pm. The building now needs its furniture and ICT attachments completed within it. We are still awaiting the server for the computers to come from the Ministry of Education. KIWA informed Gisborne Principals' Association Meeting that this would be by the end of THIS term! We wish to have an official opening of the ICT Learning Centre following this work. Funding options are being sought to add to the original plans to ensure the effective use of the ICT Learning Centre.

2. **Effective changes to be made to the SENCO's Home Room.** Synd. B has paid for modern furniture for the SENCO in the Dental Clinic. A quote has been approved by the Board to have the walls of the Dental Clinic removed so that the three small rooms can be made into one large room. The principal is seeking funding for this important alteration to improve curriculum and special needs learning programmes.

3. Our trampoline must be set in an OSH complying "pit". The Board is investigating options and funding for this!

## **ATHLETICS POSTPONEMENT.**

The Manutuke School Athletic Sports were postponed and have had to be transferred to term 4 of this year. This was due to the GDC incorrectly working on the Awapuni Stadium's tracks i.e. dumping tons of soil on the track, at the time that our school had booked the Stadium.

DENTAL HEALTH Messages.

Dear Parents/ Caregivers,

Could you please sign and return your child's Dental Advice Form to school, as soon as is possible? Your child's medical history update is important to us in carrying out our tasks or requirements for your child. Thank you. Nurse Vicki.

A NEW Brushing Technique!

Brush thoroughly, swish the spit AROUND the mouth, sucking it between the teeth for 30 seconds, then spit out, but don't rinse the mouth out!! This reduces dental decay by up to 25%!

On tooth-brushing:

1. All children should use ADULT toothpaste – it has MORE fluoride!
2. Very young children should use only a smear of toothpaste.
3. Use a small, soft toothbrush, for young children.
4. Parents should get children to brush from the FIRST moment the first teeth come through.

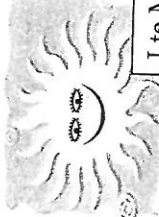

### Manutuke School's Behaviour Standards.

In our latest review the following standards were confirmed:

1. Listen to the teacher – immediately.
2. Listen, without talking.
3. Stop, look and listen - to control my behaviour.
4. Stop, look and listen – to keep safe.
5. Use courteous manners.
6. Complete given tasks.
7. Respect property.

We also have 14 guidelines for  
children and teachers to follow –  
at Playground and Manual times.

### Consequences.

1. A WARNING.
2. TIME OUT.
3. Write out the school/ classroom rules.
4. Write a letter/report to parents telling of the problem.
5. Call parents in for their assistance.

*There will be times when an incident, warrants the consequence to jump to step 4 or 5.*

N.B. Each Class has its own Behaviour Management Plan and some teachers may choose to follow the school's Plan.

*The consequences, of the school or class plan may include detention. This means that the child is kept late in school/class or loss of privilege. This occurs usually when the child's behaviour is at-risk or is a repeat of an at risk behaviour.*

*The principal decides on the following consequences: In-school suspension / isolation this means the child does not have breaks with the school or the child does not work in their classroom or can mean both of these. Stand down or suspension may occur also and are at the discretion of the Principal who will follow the guidelines of Section 14 of the Education Act 1989. Outside assistance may be needed. This must be done so in liaison with the parents.*

Parents will be informed in the following ways, especially if a child reaches steps 3 or 4 or the *Italics* section:

A copy of the child's letter or report – to be signed and returned to the school; a phone call from the class teacher; a phone call from the teacher on duty; a phone call from the Principal.

### Spelling Tricks.

Mnemonics – pronounced nemonics – is a device to help you to remember things. You can use mnemonics in SPELLING!

- e.g. 1. When to use stationery and stationary: A parked car is stationary BUT papere is stationery.  
2. When to use piece and NOT peace: A piece of pie.

### Timestable Tricks – to look for patterns to get the correct answer!

e.g. What patterns can you find in the 3 timestable – some apply to ALL timestables!

$3 \times 1 = 3$   $3 \times 2 = 6$   $3 \times 3 = 9$   $3 \times 4 = 12$   $3 \times 5 = 15$   $3 \times 6 = 18$   $3 \times 7 = 21$   $3 \times 8 = 24$   $3 \times 9 = 27$   $3 \times 10 = 30$   $3 \times 11 = 33$   $3 \times 12 = 36$

1 pattern: All factors in multiplication can be reversed e.g.  $3 \times 10 = 30$  and  $10 \times 3 = 30$ .

pattern: In multiplication – DIVISION is the opposite of Multiplication:  $30 \div 10 = 3$  and  $30 \div 3 = 10$

3 pattern: The products always move, up or down, *in sets of three*.

4 pattern: When you add the digits across-ways in each product, you will find that they *will always total 3 or 6 or 9*. Try it - add the digits across -  $3 = 3$ ,  $6 = 6$ ,  $9 = 9$ ,  $12 = 3$ ,  $15 = 6$ ,  $18 = 9$ ,  $21 = 3$ ,  $24 = 6$ ,  $27 = 9$ , and so on.

Therefore if you write that  $3 \times 9 = 28$ , quickly add/check the two digits 2 and the 8 in the product 28, they total 10. *Not a 3 or 6 or 9 - therefore this is incorrect!*

There are other patterns – see if you can find them.

*Try to find tricks to help you in other times-tables!*
